Lenten Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

That greeting might cause at least one or two of you to say to yourselves, 'Oh, yeah, it is still Lent, isn't it!' With all of the strange changes we are experiencing in our lives, it would be very understandable if we forgot that we are still in the season of Lent (for one more week). I suspect that, if we were to grade ourselves, more than a few of us would say we have flunked Lent this year! Whether or not that is your situation, I think you will find encouragement in our online worship service this Sunday.

This Sunday is Palm Sunday, which marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred week of the year for Christians. We will again be offering an online worship service where we will pray, sing traditional Palm Sunday hymns, and I will preach a message about flunking Lent and finding freedom. As in previous weeks, the service will be posted on our website and will be included in an email I will send to you before Sunday morning. We will also provide a bulletin with the greeting, prayers and words to the hymns that you may wish to use to follow along with the service as you watch it online.

Beginning on Monday, I will be sending a Scripture passage and a prayer for each day of Holy Week. The Scripture readings will all be from the "Suffering Servant" passage in the book of Isaiah, and they will be the same verses that are on our Scripture card readings for the week. The Scripture card will be provided in the Monday Messenger.

I want to re-emphasize how important it is that we all stay connected to each other during this time of forced physical separation and social distancing. It is especially important that we reach out to express our love and concern for one another. I am exceedingly grateful for the technology that allows us to communicate and to remain connected. If you know of anyone who for some reason is not receiving our emails or cannot access our website, please let me or Judy know. We want to do everything we can to make sure no one is excluded from these essential means of communication while we are physically apart.

Finally, remember to pray for our church, our nation, and our world. Pray that God will bring an end to this terrible pandemic. Pray for all in our church family who are suffering in any way. And pray that we might all grow in our trust and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, who came that we may have life, and have it abundantly (John 10:10).

Treasurer's Report March 24, 2020

Some of this information is a duplicate since it is posted in the 2nd Monday of the Month Messenger. Checking account balance is an estimate, even though I have tried to anticipate checks that have not vet cleared the bank.

January contributions \$30,548.00

February contributions \$30,153.34

Weekly budget requirements are \$8306.42, so that leaves a deficit of \$5750.34 for January and February.

Unfortunately we only had two Sundays for March with actual attendance at church. Since then checks have been coming in the mail and directly from banks and we are making a weekly deposit.

March contributions so far \$21,781.56

We are obviously faced with a larger deficit for March. There will be one more deposit this month. I have approximated a budget including salaries, insurance, utilities, and other must pay bills and came up with about \$6800.00 that is absolutely necessary to maintain the building, pay staff, etc. Keep in mind this is a rough estimate as long as our programs and ministries are suspended.

The approximate checking account balance is \$38,600. The Money Market account balance is \$99,393.82. Our designated or restricted account balances total approximately \$82,805. The largest portion of that is \$39,000 in the capital reserve. The children and youth have funds that are on hold for designated missions that may not occur and might be refunded to the parents. There is \$21,500 for a new van. When these items are taken into account, our cash flow does not look as good as it should. Fortunately God is in control. Faith Harbor has had financial issues in the past and we have survived and even thrived.
