I have good news for those of you who are ready for this year to be over: this Sunday is the last Sunday of the year ... on the Christian calendar, that is!

The Christian calendar begins each year on the first Sunday of Advent, which this year is November 29<sup>th</sup>. That means that this Sunday, November 22<sup>nd</sup>, is the last Sunday of the church year, known as Christ the King Sunday.
