Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

The first month of the year is now nearly over, and I am excited about all that the Lord has planned for our church in 2021. He will surely accomplish those plans in His perfect timing as we faithfully follow Him into the future that He is preparing for us. In the meantime, I want to take one last moment to gratefully reflect on what the Lord accomplished in and through our church in the year that ended not quite a month ago.

Last year's accomplishments are fresh on my mind because we are in the annual season of reporting statistical information to our Conference. The statistical tables require us to provide yearly numbers for everything from membership and attendance to financial giving, indebtedness and operating expenses. We all know what kind of a year 2020 was, with the pandemic and the resulting economic downturn. When the pandemic began and we had to make the decision not to hold in-person worship services, I was certainly concerned about what the impact would be for our church. Many churches were severely affected in 2020 by the inability to hold worship services and a significant reduction in financial contributions. That was not the case for us at Faith Harbor, thanks be to God!

While we did receive fewer tithes and offerings in 2020 than we had budgeted, the shortfall was minimal and was almost entirely attributable to the lack of receipts known as "loose offerings." These are funds in the form of currency placed in the offering plates on Sundays, often by visitors. COVID-19 of course required us to discontinue the practice of passing the offering plates on Sundays, but our members nonetheless found ways to financially support the church as generously as ever. And because our expenses were reduced by a far greater amount than the reduction in giving, we finished the year remarkably well financially.

Perhaps what is most remarkable is that we didn't just hoard every penny we received out of uncertainly and fear; we moved forward in faith to position ourselves for future ministry. We purchased a new church bus; we invested in high quality cameras and other A/V equipment to allow us to provide live streaming of our worship services; we hired an architect to develop a floor plan, elevation and three-dimensional renderings of a proposed new building. Moreover, we paid 100% of our apportionment responsibilities to the Conference, we paid our staff in full and we paid all our bills—all in the midst of a pandemic and a global recession!

I used the word "we" a lot in the previous paragraph, but the truth is "we" were able to do all those things only because the Lord granted us the ability to do them. I could easily and quite accurately exchange the word "we" with the word "He." Our Lord did all those things through us. He guided and shepherded us in 2020, and He will surely do so in 2021. Seeing what He accomplished through us in such a difficult and challenging year, I can hardly wait to see what He will do through us and among us when this pandemic is over. To God be the glory!
