Grace and peace to each of you in this New Year!

It has been a less than encouraging week for those of us who had hoped to leave the troubles of 2020 behind by flipping the calendar. The events in our nation's Capitol building on Wednesday certainly did not indicate that things are getting any better. Images of angry, violent mobs with utter disregard for the law, tear gas, shootings, destruction and death: it reminds me all too much of 2020!

If there is anything positive to come out of the terrible events in our world over the last year, it is that people must surely be realizing how uncertain life is, and that placing trust in any human being, human institution or human system of government is utterly futile. Faced with this realization, people will be hungry for something that is certain and trustworthy ... and that is where the Church comes in. Some would say that "church" is just another human institution, but we know that the Church was instituted by our Lord Jesus Christ. He said He would build his Church, and that the gates of hell would not prevail against it (Mt. 16:18). He also said that He is the way, the truth and the life (John 14:6). It is our role as the Church to point people to Jesus, the Way, and to the hope, peace, truth, certainty and fulfillment in life that He alone can provide.

There are people all around us who are hungering for what Jesus has to offer. More and more people are moving to our area, people who will need a church home where they can find support and connection and encouragement on their walk with the Lord. I want Faith Harbor to be positioned to receive these people who are hungry to know Jesus.

This year will be extremely important in the life of our church. First and foremost, we need to be sure that we are a Church founded on the truth of God's Word, so that we can offer truth to a world that is starving for it. Watch very soon for several opportunities our church will be offering to engage in Bible studies, in-person and virtually. Secondly, we need to be an invitational church, reaching out to people around us and inviting them to be part of our church family. A large part of being inviting is having facilities that are appealing and accommodating to those who are looking for a church home. Later this month our New Building Steering Committee will present the architectural schematic designs for our proposed new building to our Leadership Council. These exciting architect's renderings will be posted on our website.

In spite of, or perhaps in response to the discouraging events in our world, I believe that 2021 can be a year when Faith Harbor more than ever lives into our calling to be "A Beacon of Hope in a Broken World." I am glad to be sharing this journey of faith with such a loving, generous and faithful church family. I am looking forward to what this new year will bring, fully confident that the Lord of the Church goes before us into 2021.
