Project Agape is turning attention to helping these internally displaced persons trying to survive in a bitter cold environment. We have been asked to help by sending much needed supplies that are very hard to find in Eastern Armenia.

Items due at the church tomorrow and next Saturday from 12:00-3:00 and Wednesdays (3rd & 10th) from 7:00-9:00pm. Space is reserved in the Harbor Warehouse for the items to be sent to Armenia.

The Thrift Store Warehouse has a specific space marked off by two large racks and signage that designates ARMENIA...AGAPE PROJECT ONLY.

This week SOMEONE entered the warehouse and used all the racks for donated items to the Thrift Store which we appreciate but not in the designated AGAPE space. IT is critical that all items for AGAPE be sealed in boxes with a listing on exterior of box as to the contents.

The designated space is to keep other donations for the Thrift Store separate.

PLEASE help us maintain separation of these two entities. The Agape Project ends March 13, 2021.

Lenten Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord!

I am writing this on Thursday evening, February 25, after having watched a presentation earlier this evening by Carl Ward, who is on the New Building Steering Committee of our church. Carl showed his excellent presentation tonight to members of our Faith Harbor Leadership Council. It is virtually the same presentation that we will take to lending institutions when we are ready to procure financing for the new building.

It occurred to me that there are probably many people in our church family who don't know about our plans to build. I want to be sure you know where to find the architectural renderings of the proposed building expansion. By clicking on this link, you will be taken to a page on our website that features artist's renderings of the building expansion.

I find it very exciting to think about all of the ministries and programs that will one day take place in these new facilities. There will be a large fellowship hall with a kitchen that is roughly twice as large as our current kitchen. I can only imagine all of the fellowship meals, meetings and receptions that will take place in those facilities. We will also have several new classrooms that will be used for Sunday school classes, Bible studies, youth groups and various other meetings.

I am especially excited about the prospect of opening a pre-school in our building. Classrooms and restrooms in the new building have been designed to accommodate a pre-school or day care. I view this as a ministry that will help to meet a great need in our community. You will be hearing more about this ministry opportunity in the near future.

I am deeply grateful for those on our New Building Steering Committee who have moved forward with the development of these plans even in the midst of a pandemic. I especially want to thank Don Mizelle, the chair of the committee, along with Carl Ward and John Weaver for all of their hard work. We are very blessed and fortunate to have persons in our church family with their professional expertise and servants' hearts.

I want to come to a close by thanking all of you as well. We could not even think about a building expansion if it were not for the generosity of our church family in supporting the Build the Vision Fund, which is up to roughly 500 thousand dollars. We would not be in position to approach a lending institution if we were not on solid financial footing, thanks to your generosity in supporting our church even during a pandemic.

We are all abundantly blessed to be a part of our Faith Harbor church family, and I am exceedingly blessed to be the pastor of such a faithful and generous church. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!


