Dear Faith Harbor Family,

I am writing this week with information regarding the Bible study we are offering during the season of Lent. Lent is the period of forty days leading up to Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday, which is on February 17th this year. The study this year is called *Listen to Him*. Following is a description of the study:

It happened on perhaps the best day of his life so far, the day before the day Jesus would make the journey to the worst day of his life. Jesus and three of his disciples gathered on a high mountain where Jesus was transfigured right before their eyes. The voice of God spoke three thunderously piercing words into the minds and hearts of those disciples. They were as follows: LISTEN TO HIM.

Those words now come to us, the present-day disciples of Jesus. The forty days of Lent open up a journey from the top of Transfiguration Mountain to the bottom of the Valley of the Cross. These forty days provide forty steps, if you will, to lean in and listen deeply to Jesus. As we do so we find the way of the cross is the road to resurrection. Listening to Jesus—it's our highest calling to the lowest place where we discover our lives transformed and our worst days breaking forth into our best life.

Listen To Him is a video based group Bible study, with individual daily devotional readings for each of the forty days of Lent. The study encompasses Luke 9:18 through Luke 24:8. We plan to offer both an in-person and a virtual (Zoom) group meeting. Tentatively, one session will be on Tuesday evening and one on Wednesday evening, but that is subject to change. Let me know if you would like to participate but you can't make either of those days. I am certainly open to adding a session at a different time, if necessary.

I hope many in our church family will be a part of this study as we journey together through Lent and learn how to better listen to our Lord.

Having these bags ready and available in our vehicles can allow us to be prepared to help those individuals on the spot. We decided we would start out by making 20 Bags up and go from there.
