Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Perhaps most of you know that the outcome of our church conference last Sunday was overwhelming approval (greater than 9 out of 10 votes cast) for the construction of two additional classrooms on the east end of our building that will enable us to pursue the vision of a pre-school/child-care ministry. I will plan to regularly use this space in our Messenger to keep the church informed of our progress.

I will begin with a reminder that the funds to pay for this addition (which we are calling Phase 1 of our building plans) have already been raised through the Build the Vision (BTV) campaign. It is important for all of us to know that the BTV funds are designated funds that cannot be used for anything other than building onto the church. We should all be grateful for the faithfulness and generosity of those who have contributed to BTV. I know that includes many of you who are reading this letter! Abundant and sincere thanks to each of you!

Our BTV funds, with a present value of nearly \$525,000.00, are currently invested with the United Methodist Foundation (UMF). As with all investments, there is a measure of risk involved. Persons on our finance and trustee committees who are authorized to act on behalf of the church have determined to remove from risk the amount we will need for Phase 1 construction, with generous allowance for overages (just under \$350,000.00 total). We have taken action this week to withdraw all but \$175,000.00 from our investment accounts. We will deposit the receipts into a new checking account where they will be available for the exclusive use of Phase 1 construction. Any money that is not spent for Phase 1 will be added back to the \$175,000.00 which remains invested with UMF to go toward Phase 2 of our BTV plans and dreams.

Our next steps will be to identify a project manager and procure a contractor. Our Building Steering Committee will serve in an advisory and oversight capacity as we move forward. We will make every effort to be as transparent and informative as possible.

May we always keep in mind that these efforts are all being made for the purpose of being in ministry with and for those in our community we are called to serve. God is clearly at work in our midst and I believe He has great plans for Faith Harbor. It is a privilege to be a part of furthering His Kingdom here in Surf City and the surrounding area. To God be the glory!
