Easter Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!

I hope you have been able to enjoy the gloriously beautiful weather this week that is so fitting for the Easter season.

At my house, the sub-freezing temperatures early on Good Friday last week caused dieback on several plants. One of my plants appeared to be completely dead. This morning I started to pull it up, but I noticed that new growth is emerging around the base of it. So, instead of yanking it up and getting rid of it, I cut out the damaged branches, gave it some water and carefully mulched around it. Although the future is uncertain, I believe my plant will soon be thriving and blooming in spite of the damage it suffered last week. I can't wait to see how it turns out!

On Sunday April 11th the members of our church will have an opportunity to vote on proceeding with a construction project to add two classrooms to our building that we hope will ultimately be used to operate a pre-K school in our church. Instead of waiting until the end of 2022 (at the earliest) when all indications are that there will be a separation in our church, this addition is something we can move forward with now. We are blessed to have the financial resources to proceed with this project and to utilize what God has provided to us to help meet a tremendous need in our community for quality child-care. That need will persist regardless of what happens with our denomination.

This coming Tuesday, April 13th at 6:30 PM, our Children's Minister Melissa Schleinkofer will make a Zoom presentation to the church about opening a pre-K school in our church. All church members are welcome to be virtually present to view Melissa's presentation. An invitation will be sent to the email addresses of church members and will also be available on our website.

The church vote will take place after the 9:20 worship service on Sunday, April 18th. According to our *United Methodist Book of Discipline,* only church members who are present will be allowed to vote. We will provide a ballot to members of our church at the conclusion of the 9:20 service. We will allow drive-by voting for those members who wish to vote but are still not comfortable with gathering in the building. Someone will be out front under the portico between 10:00 and 10:30 AM to provide ballots for members who do not wish to enter the building. All other members will receive a ballot in the narthex following the worship service. There will be a short presentation with a question-and-answer session in the sanctuary at 10:30 prior to the vote.

I hope many of you will plan to watch Melissa's presentation on the 13th and be present for the church vote on the 18th. Although the future is uncertain, I believe this project is an opportunity for Faith Harbor to continue to thrive and grow, in spite of the pandemic we have all suffered through in the last year. I can't wait to see how it turns out!
