MESSENGER MAY 7, 2021

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

I am writing this on Friday morning, while also looking out my window watching it rain. It is the first significant rainfall that we have had in quite some time. We have missed several good opportunities in the last few weeks, as it appeared from looking at the radar that we were in the path of several storms that ultimately either dissipated or made a turn to avoid us. In fact, I wasn't confident this one would make it to us until it was finally on top of us!

I don't know about you, but sometimes when we are going through a dry spell it can make me wonder how long it will last, how bad it will get, how dried up the earth will become, how many plants might die before we ever get any rain. As I am listening now to the thunder and the rain on my roof, it seems to me that those sounds are reassurances of God's goodness, and promises of God's love for his creation. This long-awaited thundershower may not completely make up our rainfall deficit, but it will surely cause the grass to turn green again and raise the level of the ponds and bring refreshment and healing and renewal to the earth.

It can be very much the same in our lives. If you will allow me to speak of the pandemic metaphorically, we have all been through a very severe drought for the last year. The pandemic has prevented us (or at least limited us) from gathering together, seeing our families, exchanging smiles and handshakes and hugs with friends. It has resulted in the loss of far too many lives. But there are promising indications all around us that the pandemic is coming to an end. Due primarily to the fact that people are getting vaccinated, things are largely opening up again, families and friends are gathering together; we are even getting glimpses of one another's faces! I believe the vaccines are an answer to prayer and are evidence of God's goodness and love. The pandemic is not over yet, and the vaccines will not make up for what we have lost, but it does seem that a long-awaited time of healing and renewal is here at last.

Many of us have issues other than the pandemic that we are facing. Illness, financial setbacks, depression, addiction, marital difficulties, troubled children, legal problems, grief, loneliness: these are just a few examples of the trials and tribulations that can make life feel parched and devoid of joy. Sometimes it can feel like these times of trouble will never end, and to be sure, this life will never be trouble-free. Jesus affirmed this when he said to his followers in John 16:33, "In the world you will have tribulation." Yet he immediately followed that by saying, "But take heart; I have overcome the world."

The examples of drought-ending rainfall and pandemic-ending vaccines bear witness to God's goodness and love, and remind us that the troubles of this life will not last forever. Psalm 30:5 teaches us that, "Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning." So whatever troubles and trials you are in the midst of, take heart, knowing that they will not last. Jesus has overcome the world! Joy is coming soon!
