Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!

At various times in my life, my favorite season of the year has been different. I am always grateful and ready for the change of seasons when they come, whether it is winter to spring, spring to summer, summer to fall or fall to winter. Winter has never quite made it to the top of my favorite season list, although I do love Christmas and snow (to a point!) and cozying up to a warm fire. For most of my life I have said that fall is my favorite season. Who doesn't love crisp, clear days and the beautiful colors of autumn? In more recent years, spring became my favorite. That might have something to do with moving to the south, where we usually have a "real spring" with many days of pleasant weather while the gorgeous azaleas and dogwoods bloom and the world bursts forth with new life.
