MESSENGER SEPTEMBER 24, 2021

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

I want to take the opportunity in this week's Messenger to inform you about an informational session that I plan to lead on Sunday, October 3rd beginning shortly after the conclusion of our 9:20 worship service.

Many of you know that conversations are currently taking place in churches around our denomination about the *Protocol for Separation* that is expected to be approved at General Conference in August of 2022. We had similar conversations here at Faith Harbor shortly after the *Protocol* was announced in early 2020.

These conversations are taking place more earnestly of late because it is very likely that the *Protocol* will be approved in less than a year. If and when that happens, every local United Methodist Church including Faith Harbor will need to decide on a significant change. We will not have the option of staying the same or being neutral.

Specifically, our church will decide by congregational vote whether to:

- a) retain the name *United Methodist* with profound changes to our current policies on human sexuality and marriage, or;
- b) retain our current policies on human sexuality and marriage while adopting a different denominational name.

As the pastor here at Faith Harbor, I believe you need and deserve to know where I stand and how I intend to lead. Moreover, as the Bishop and Cabinet begin making decisions about pastoral appointments shortly after the first of the year, our Conference needs to know where Faith Harbor stands and where I stand on this issue.

It will not be my intention in this presentation to focus on the history of our denominational disagreements or the details of the *Protocol for Separation*. I provided that information when the *Protocol* was first announced. There will certainly be a need for us to talk further about the details of the *Protocol* and its implementation. However, my intention in this presentation is to speak directly about the same-sex issues at the center of our denominational disagreement.

I believe there are well-meaning people and strong arguments on both sides, and for many the question is, what are we to believe? So I am calling this presentation:

What to Believe? What's Next For Us?

Considering the cultural, scientific and biblical views on same-sex attraction

and practice, and how this issue will impact our church.

Further details will be forthcoming over the next week. In the meantime, I hope you will please keep our denomination, Faith Harbor and me in your prayers.

After recently meeting with our Youth Council and Pastor David, we have decided to continue to meet in our "Sub Groups" on designated Sundays (similar to how we did it last year) for now. Below is how we would like to arrange our age groups and meetings.

*High School Youth (10th Grade High Schoolers) Group B-1~ Meets on the 2nd & 4th Sundays of the month

*High School Youth (All other High Schoolers) Group B-2~ Meets on the 2nd & 4th Sundays of the month

*Middle School Youth (Older Middle Schoolers) Group A-1~ Meets on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of the month

*This is a bit different from last year due to changes in age groups/sizes & youth moving up. I will send out a text to everyone to let them know what "sub group" their youth are in, but basically for the most part- they are with the kids they have always been with because of separation by age/group of kids they started with.
