Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

In last week's Messenger I wrote to inform you about an informational session that I plan to lead this Sunday, October 3<sup>rd</sup> beginning shortly after the conclusion of our 9:20 worship service. I am calling the presentation:

#### What to Believe? What's Next For Us?

# Considering the cultural, scientific and biblical views on same-sex attraction and practice, and how this issue will impact our church.

I stated that my intention in this presentation is to speak directly about the same-sex issues over which our denomination is very likely to divide next year. I plan to be clear about where I stand and how I intend to lead our church.

There has been a considerable amount of interest in this presentation since I announced it. Accordingly, I think it is important to establish some expectations.

First, I want to be clear that this Sunday will not be a conversation so much as a presentation. We will not have a debate, nor do I plan to take any questions. The reason for not taking questions is partly in the interest of time, and partly out of concern that such questions could very easily turn into expressions of opinion. This is not the right time or occasion for people to express their opinions or defend their views. That time will very likely come, but this Sunday I simply want to present what is on my heart.

I will be more than happy to respond afterwards to questions that are directed to me via email, text, a phone call or an in-person visit. If there is sufficient interest, I would also be happy to schedule a question-and-answer session at a later date.

At the conclusion of the presentation, I will be inviting you to join me in a three-month period of prayer and discernment, seeking God's direction and will for our church. We will come back together again shortly after the first of the year to share what we have discerned.

Some have asked if we will live stream and record the presentation. We are currently not planning to live stream it but we do plan to record it and post it on our website later.

Brothers and sisters, we know that the months ahead will be difficult for our denomination and for Faith Harbor. I hope and pray that we will show our community and the world that, as followers of Jesus Christ, we are able to love one another in spite of our disagreements.

I hope to see many of you on Sunday.

If you feel lead to contribut make your check out to FHUMC and on the memo line mark "World Communion Sunday". There is a pamphlet in the bulletin this Sunday.




## COMING SOON BIBLE STUDY CLASS
