Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Many of you know that prior to the COVID pandemic, Faith Harbor was blessed each summer to have a ministerial intern from Duke Divinity School (DDS) serving among and with us. We hosted two wonderful interns virtually during the summer of 2020, but we did not apply for an intern last summer with the restrictions that remained in place due to COVID.

Earlier this month I received an invitation to apply for an intern for the summer of 2022. The invitation included this statement: "All placements for Summer 2022 will be fully in-person, following best practices ... as recommended by the CDC and Duke University." While "best practices" may be modified by the time summer rolls around, it at least seems clear that we would be able to host an intern in-person this summer pending application approval.

DDS requires that placement settings not within commuting distance of Duke (like Faith Harbor) must be able to provide no-cost housing for the intern. Before applying for an intern, I would need to confirm that we can commit to providing housing.

Following is an excerpt regarding intern housing from the DDS Field Education Policy and Procedures manual:

Hosting a ministry intern is a tremendous expression of hospitality and support, and a sign of the church's partnership in ministry. This commitment requires the emotional and relational preparation of the entire household. It may involve physical preparation of the living environment. Hosting a student in a home is not the same as having a family member or friend stay for a short visit. An invitation is extended to an unfamiliar person to live in your midst. Communication between the host and the student is crucial. From the beginning of the relationship to the end, it is important for everyone in the living environment to respectfully discuss needs and expectations.

Each living environment is unique. Each student has a distinct personality. Some students enjoy being treated as a part of the family and join family gatherings. Other students will feel a strong need for privacy and personal space and may not be as involved in family activities. It is best for hosts to understand their role as that of offering a housing arrangement. In this arrangement, hosts and students both have the right to courtesy, respect, and communication. Friendships that may develop beyond mutual respect and good will are added blessings of the host's offering.

Having read the above, if you feel you might be in position to offer housing for an intern this summer, please contact Kim MacDougall in our church office for a checklist of specific guidelines from the Office of Field Education. The application deadline is February 18th, so please contact me prior to that date if you are feeling led to provide housing for an intern.



The Colossian Way Sexuality Small Group

You are invited to join us in The Colossian Way Human Sexuality Small Group. It is a Christian practice rooted in the beautiful line in Colossians 1:17 that "all things hold together in Christ". The goal of this 10-week session is to deepen our love of God and love of neighbor as we work together through the difficult issues facing our church.

The Colossian Way is a Christian practice made up of five parts. Each session will begin with an invitation to **gather**. This will be followed with a reminder through Scripture about the deeper meaning of **Christian unity**. The third section is called **Prayer** as we seek to turn to God and prepare to dialogue about a specific issue. This leads us into a section called **Engage** which offers a deeper dive into the issue itself, and in which each of us are invited to share openly as we freely choose. The goal isn't to push us to a particular viewpoint, but to learn to focus on our most difficult questions in ways that build up our congregation

We close with a section called **Godward**, in which we offer up praise to God, as well as our worries and hopes and discern any sense of what God is leading us to do.

This five-part practice takes 90 minutes, and we offer 10 sessions so that the practice happens ten times. The goal is to gather as Christians, practice this way of entering a difficult topic to gain progress on the problem while loving each other and God, and in the process see the body of Christ grow.

The groups are composed of 8-12 people who make up a diversity of ages, genders, and perspectives on this issue so that the group can learn to grow Christian virtues (patience, long-suffering, forbearance, love, etc.) across their differences as they meet over 10 weeks. *It is possible to miss one or two meetings, but if you know you cannot make it to three or more of the meetings, it's probably not good for you to participate at this time.
