Letter from your Lay Leader



To grant to those who mourn in Zion, giving them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of morning, the mantle of praise instead of a spirit of fainting. So, they will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that He may be glorified. Isaiah 61:3

You are completely covered in and identified by the tunic of praise the Father has given to you, simply because He is head over heels in love with you. Joseph's doting Dad provided a unique tunic for his favorite son. You could see Joseph coming a mile down the dusty road in his colorful tunic. Not only was Joseph's tunic beautiful, but it was also representative of Joseph's intimate relationship with his father. The type of robe Israel provided for Joseph was a garment of favoritism and of

leadership. It was also associated with a high social and political status.

Your Father, because He loves you so dearly, has also provided a special tunic for you, just as Jacob did for Joseph. Your garment is multicolored and extraordinarily beautiful. The world should see you coming as you walk through storms, challenges, and disappointments in life, displaying your covering, provided through an intimate and loving relationship with your heavenly Father. The tunic you have been given to wear throughout all of life is a garment of praise.

My friend, you are dressed and completely enveloped in the Father's love for you. The very first recognizable trait that others should observe about your life is how you are blanketed, from head to toe, in your worship of Him. The tunic Joseph was given by his fathers was used to signify two particular values: leadership and royalty. The garment bequeathed to you by your Father represents the same two values. You are a servant — leader because of your family heritage in Christ. and you are deemed as royalty not because of anything you have done, but because of who your Spiritual Father is. Your Father longs for you to remove the sackcloth and ashes from your life, so He can dress you in a garment worthy of honor.

The issue of pain and how we handle it as believers is a challenging one. Refuse to be trapped by the quicksand of your devastating circumstances, instead choose to love, and obey God, even when your world seems to be falling apart. Hold fast to God and His promises, despite deep emotional pain. There is an abundance of God's blessings when ordinary people chose to love God continuously.

Wear your tunic of praise proudly.


