



Psalm 107.8-9: "Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind. For he satisfies the thirsty, and the hungry he fills with good things."

This passage makes me think of how we are to hunger and thirst after righteousness (Matthew 5.6). The Psalmist calls us to be a people that are satisfied by the Lord – but the passage tells us that this satisfaction is for the thirsty and the hungry – it is not for those who are well fed and those who have plenty to drink. Instead, God is in the process of satisfying the thirsty and hungry.

The Gospel message we proclaim is actually good news! The good news is that the Lord satisfies those who are hungry and thirsty. Jesus didn't come to save the righteous – instead he came to save sinners. And those sinners are thirsty and hungry for the Gospel message. My sisters & brothers – I would encourage you to share this good news with your friends, family, and neighbors. It is the good news that is found in Jesus Christ. And when someone is hungry – may we be a people that help folks to find the bread of heaven that is found in Jesus Christ. And when someone is thirsty – may we be a people that help folks to find the cup of salvation that is found in Jesus Christ. For in this heavenly meal, we get the humble opportunity to taste together and see together that God is good – and that the Lord's mercy endures forever. ~Philip Chryst
