


Psalm 91.2: "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust."

Theodicy is a theological term that talks about the problem of evil. Theodicy wrestles through a question that goes like this: how could a good God that created all things – end up with a world that has so much evil? Philosophers and theologians have struggled through this concept for thousands of years – and this struggle has never really been solved in a way that all can agree. Fyodor Dostoevsky spent numerous pages captivating his readers with this notion of theodicy, that he put into narrative form, in his monumental work called *Brothers Karamazov*. (Just for the record – I highly recommend this book – and if you ever want to discuss it let me know). At the end of his treatise – Dostoevsky can only write of forgiveness and God's right to forgive – even in the midst of evil.


One of my favorite paintings is of Saint Anthony in the desert. Saint Anthony fled the luxuries of wealth and prosperity and sold his possessions and gave them to the poor. He did this by going out into the wilderness to do battle with evil – to do battle with the devil. Michelangelo's

first painting (some scholars believe he created this when he was 12-13 years old) highlights the problem of evil using Saint Anthony as his backdrop. You can see the cruelty of evil that inflicts pain and suffering on the hermit. Yet the monk is composed and contemplative in his response to evil.

In Psalm 91.2 – the Psalmist declares: "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust." In the midst of the evils of this world – the important thing for us is the character and identity of who God is. Here the psalmist reminds us that our God is a refuge and a fortress. And not just any fortress, but our fortress. That the God we serve has made a way for us to trust even in the midst of evil. That the God we serve is a refuge when the rains come – when the winds come – when the hail comes – when the hurricanes come – when the floods come. Because we know that evil is present in this world – and that evil comes seeking someone to devour.

Monday Afternoon Bible Study

Monday Afternoon Bible Study- Psalms: Prayers of the Heart with Eugene Peterson* We started our study this week on Psalms. Our focus this week was on an introduction to the Psalms. Several points we would like to share with you from our time together:

- People look into mirrors to see how they look; they look into the Psalms to find out who they are. A mirror is an excellent way to learn about our appearance; the Psalms are the biblical way to discover ourselves.
- The Psalms are poetry, and the Psalms are prayer. These two features need to be kept in mind always. If either is forgotten, the Psalms will not only be misunderstood but misused.
- Poetry is language used with intensity. Prayer is language used in relation to God
- Prayer is answering speech. God's Word has not done its complete work until it evokes an answer from us. All our answers are prayers. The Psalms train us in this answering speech, this language that responds to all God's creating and saving words targeted to our lives.
- Our usual approach to God's Word is to ask, What is God saying to me? That is almost always the correct question when reading Scripture. But in the Psalms the question is, How do I answer the God who speaks to me?
- And so we bring a somewhat different mindset to the Psalms than we do to the rest of Scripture—we are learning to pray, not study, although the two activities will always be interconnected.
- Everything that anyone can feel or experience in relation to God is in these prayers. You will find them the best place in Scripture to explore all the parts of your life and then to say who you are and what is in you—guilt, anger, salvation, praise—to the God who loves, judges and saves you in Jesus Christ. These twelve studies are designed to guide you into twelve interior dimensions of your life and bring them to expression before God.
