



"He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.'" Luke 11.1

It has always been fascinating to me that the only time the disciples ever asked Jesus to teach them anything – it was to teach them how to pray.

Remember, they would call Jesus Rabbi – which means teacher. The only time it is recorded in the Bible that the disciples asked their Rabbi to teach them anything, it was how to pray. And that is when Jesus introduces them to this pattern of prayer that we have come to call the Lord's prayer.

Prayer is an ancient pattern of communicating with God, but it is also a way of living out a posture of paying attention to what the Lord is doing in our midst. We are called to be people that have the ears to hear and eyes to see what the Holy Spirit is doing through the Church. As we practice this attitude of curiosity we can be like Moses who recognizes that something suspicious is happening when the bush is not being consumed by the flames. And in that pause of looking upon the burning bush – the Lord makes himself known to Moses.

Jesus invites us into this time of being curious as we grow in our commitment to God and our commitment

to each other. As we acknowledge the fact that we are journeying beside our sisters and brothers, we discern together what the Holy Spirit is doing in our midst. We can be bold to call each other sister and brother – because we are bold to pray "Our Father". In this journey let us take on a posture of curiosity, as we link arms and traverse the mountain of the Lord, together. Let us acknowledge that we need each other. Let us acknowledge that the miraculous is happening in our midst and we are open to God even using us for that miraculous work.

During Lent, I would encourage you to devote yourself to prayer – and to pray together. In your devotion may awe and wonder fill your heart – as we continue to be bold in praying "Our Father".







