



Matthew 21.6-8 "The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road."

Could you imagine the raucous atmosphere that was going on in Jerusalem as Jesus is riding into the city? It is like a parade. There are preparations that have been made, which are fueled by numerous expectations and anticipations.

This might be the one who will restore Israel to its former glory! This might be the one who overthrows the Roman Empire! This might be the one who makes things right with the religious/political system! This might be the one who relieves the proletariat from over-taxation by the bourgeoisie! This might be the one who can make my life better! This might be the one who can get my children to behave! This might be the one who can get my spouse to not drink so much! This might be the one who....!

As a result of Jesus' arrival – the whole city is in turmoil (v10). And there is a fervor that has spiked around who this man is, and what is he there to accomplish. To the best of their knowledge, he is a prophet from a lowly town called Nazareth (v11).

This coming Sunday we will be welcoming Jesus in a way that makes sense to each of us personally. We all come to this time with anticipation and expectation. And in the festivities around Palm Sunday, Jesus comes into our lives in ways that seem very humble. I pray that we all prepare our hearts to meet Jesus in this season. Please know that he comes as one that is humble and lowly – even in the midst of a parade and fanfare.

We as a church have some work to do in preparation for the next week and a-half. We are having a church workday on Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup> from 9am-1pm. Bring your work gloves. We are going to have work to do for every skill level. We need beds weeded, bushes cut, gutters installed, construction debris removed, sticks picked up, walls taken down, HVAC hung, and maybe even some painting. This really reminds me of the simple preparations the disciples made to bring Jesus into Jerusalem. Let us prepare personally, and as a congregation, to welcome Jesus as well.
