



Mark 6.3: "Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offense at him."

Jesus was known to be a carpenter in his hometown of Nazareth. He was known as one that worked with his hands – constructing things out of materials – and in that work he created. This reflected his relationship with his earthly Father and his heavenly Father. But this was offensive to the folks in his hometown synagogue as he began to teach. For they looked at him as just the laborer that was into construction.

While on this pedagogical journey we are learning that the work we do with our hands is to be dedicated to the Lord. For the Lord has called us to a school for the Lord's service,

where we are journeying to the mountain of the Lord together. We all bring God-given gifts and talents to this fellowship of believers. And those gifts and talents are offered to the Lord so that God might do with us as seen fit. And we do this together with integrity, selflessness, intentionally, consistency, and for the common good.

There is a quote that makes me think of the integrity found in Jesus' labor as a carpenter that is from Thomas Merton, it goes like this: "The peculiar grace of a shaker chair is due to the fact that it was made by someone capable of believing that an angel might come and sit on it." On this journey, the Lord has commissioned each of us to be laborers in God's vineyard. As we work with each other, may we guard each person's dignity and save each person's pride. And when we work – may it be a work of love. May we participate with what the Holy Spirit is doing in this world, and may we do it together.

DIGGING A DITCH part 1 (Clearing out the ditch)



Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Psalm 51:10 esv

Tuesday was our first Pray, Work, Eat day. It went well, we gathered for a time of prayer, then we were each assigned a job to do. My assignment was to dig a ditch. As I started digging that ditch, I started seeing how digging a ditch was like the life of a Christian. Overtime things pile up in a ditch and it keeps it from draining properly. You can take that build up as being sin in your life. Which keeps you from hearing the word of God. No matter what that sin is, it just builds up and builds up and soon, that sin in your life is like the ditch. It used to flow so easily into the bigger drainage system, but it became clogged up and it no longer was able to flow easily. We all need to repent and clean out everything in our lives that hinders us from hearing the word of God and keeps us from being a good representation of Christ to others.

So how do we take care of that ditch? Well, you must dig it up and clean it out. How? by praying, reading your Bible, and fellowshipping with other Christians to

start opening that drain line again. Opening your communication line with God and opening it up where others can see you flowing into their lives with life and rejuvenation.

But you know, you can't do it just one time, It needs to be done every day, because if you miss a day when it rains, the debris falls in the ditch, you miss another day it rains again, things start to pour into that ditch and clogs it up again and you find yourself not being Christ to others you find yourself hiding from God because you fell prey to the ways of the world. As in the ditch pictured above you see roots, the ditch is cleared of all debris, but the roots are still there. The roots can be unforgiveness, addictions, self-centeredness, envy, evil thoughts, or anything that allows the debris from letting you flow the way God intended you too. Those roots have got to be removed.

Well today is the day you dig that ditch up. You dig it up, you clean it out and you don't do it just today you do it every day and let that water of life flow, so it doesn't get stagnant. There will be some areas in that ditch where the roots have gotten so thick you will have to pull out the hand tools, get down on your knees and cut away at those roots with prayer and fasting.

Once we are done with all our work it will be time to feast at the heavenly table with our Lord and Savior. I am ready for that day, but until Christ returns, I will be busy about my work, clearing out the ditch, so I can share the love of Christ with others.
