



This is a message that was received by Ann Cassler. I wanted to share it with you all...

Born a Catholic, married to a Lutheran, and now a Methodist! What other surprises do you have for me, God? Bruce and I were married by a Lutheran minister who was a coworker at the V.A. in Brooklyn, NY. Within a year we were transferred to Albany, NY V.A. and settled down to suburban life. I had everything I hoped for, a husband, a child and a lovely home. Life was great but Bruce had a restlessness about him concerning God and church. Within a year or so he joined the local Lutheran church, and I became an associate member. Life was wonderful and I daringly asked

God silently why He was so good to me even though I had left him behind for so long. I immediately heard the answer in my mind, a gentle, loving voice that said: because I never left you. I was stunned and shaken and grateful all at the same time. And I was determined to never leave God again! I became a real member of our church and began attending all the classes I could find to support my new found faith. I was a new person, a person who couldn't learn enough, experience enough through bible studies and retreats to satisfy my longing to come closer to God.

A few years after joining, while our daughter Nicole was in first grade, Bruce said I think God is calling you to ministry! What??! Are you kidding? No! He let me rant and then just said, Talk to pastor. And I thought, yeah right! He's going to laugh! So, I went to see our pastor and laughingly said: Bruce thinks God is calling me to ministry, hahaha. He looked at me without blinking an eye and said, you have to talk to the bishop. To make a long story short, I was in seminary in Philadelphia by the next September. Our family moved bag and baggage from a 4-bedroom colonial house to a twobedroom student housing unit. And our daughter transferred to a new school. After 4 years of seminary in Philadelphia and in Blue Bell, a northern suburb, I was kind of liking this city and thought of staying in the area. I mentioned that to my bishop on one of his visits to seminary and he became serious and said, no, you're coming back to NY. I have a church picked out for you. And so began my ministry to God's people in Victor, NY. After eight years I was called to another church in New York where I stayed until I retired, and we moved to Maryland to be closer to our daughter who was in medical school in Bethesda. We found a church to worship in and were enjoying retirement when Nicole asked us to help her find housing in North Carolina because she was being stationed at LeJeune. As we drove around and took a look at the beach, I felt like I was back home in Coney Island. This is where I want to spend the rest of my life. Two years ago, on Valentine's Day, Bruce died after a long and slow physical demise. He was 92. I did his memorial service in our backyard with only close family since the Pandemic was in full swing. It was the second Sunday of the Resurrection. When I gave my homily, I was uplifted by the thought that Bruce was resurrected with Jesus and is truly in God's presence, out of pain and I imagine him beaming as he heard God say, Well done, good and faithful servant. I was so happy for him, I walked on air for months and then it began to sink in. Happy for him but what about me? I joined a widow's group and met some lovely people, one of whom invited me to Faith Harbor to join a short-term grief group and then she casually asked if I wanted to come to church on Sunday. And so I went, not expecting anything special to happen. But was I wrong! My world went from black and white to glorious technicolor. The people, the music, and most importantly the vibrant Word of God being preached with joy and power turned on the lights in my soul that had been dim for so long! I felt like I was being born again! Born into a new way of living! Everything old was new again! After a few new member classes I was welcomed by all of you into membership in Faith Harbor. What a treasure to work in God's vineyards with such enthusiastic fellow members! Praise God, from Whom all blessings flow!


