




Vacation Bible School 2023 has been a success! Many thanks to all that made it possible.

Why do some people have better hearts than others? Why can some people eat whatever they want and never have an issue with their heart and others have to watch everything that touches their lips? Is it genetics, what we have eaten in the past, or just plain bad luck? I am not a doctor so I can't answer these questions. I just know that my 83-year-old

dad, who has always been very active and never overweight has battled with type 1 diabetes since his late 30's. He has always been careful with what he eats, he is faithful to check and notate his glucose level 4 times a day plus take his insulin. I have never seen any sugary products around him and those who know him always make a sugar free desert at church functions for him. Throughout the years he has had 8 stints put in around his heart. Monday, we found out they are all still working (praise the Lord). One stint may be a little slower than the others but seems to have been that way for a while. I say all of this, because I love my dad, but I am getting to where I do not like Father's Day. This Father's Day was the 2nd one my dad spent in the hospital. 3 years ago, my brother and I found him on the floor in his kitchen. He was lying down as if he had laid down to rest on the floor, but he had been there for 18 hours. We had come to find out he had realized he was not feeling well and didn't want to fall. He was in a coma for 2 weeks. The docs believe it was because of his diabetes but I'm not sure if that was the case, only God really knows. That was unlike any episode I had ever seen.

God has made each one of us unique. Our bodies can handle so much, it is tougher than we give it credit for. But God wants us to take care of it and treat it like a temple. Though we do not know why some of us have illnesses that weaken this temporary vessel the Lord has given us, we are still to do our best to treat it with care and fuel it properly. My dad has lived a long and prosperous life. I have prepared myself for when the time comes for my dad to meet the Lord and Savior he so dearly loves. But for now, he will continue to mow his lawn, and walk without his cane, no matter how slow he is. Because in his eyes he is as strong as he was when he was in his 20's and you cannot tell him otherwise. (This was supposed to be my letter for the messenger last week, but I didn't get it sent. Since then, my dad has gone back into the hospital battling mini seizures. I have prayed looking for answers on why my dad is going through this. Then I started praying, asking the Lord to show me what I am supposed to learn from this. In the meantime, I am starting to see the path I took when I was younger was preparing me for this time with my dad. I became a Nurse's Aide in my late 20's, never realizing what I learned would be preparing me to take care of my dad today. I never thought I would have to take care of my dad this way. But I am glad that I know how. He did so much for me, this is the least I can do for him. God is always at work, though we may not be seeing it now, in time we will.

I love the song, "Lord, listen to your children praying" it gives me so much peace knowing my Savior hears me and is always at work in my life.


