

Mark 1.1: "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ."

We are at the beginning – again. Here, we begin a new leg of our journey as a particular people called Faith Harbor United Methodist Church. As you personally begin this new leg of your journey – I would encourage you to consider, with great devotion and great attentiveness, where are you going? For the end is vitally important at the beginning. In so many ways, you can't get your bearing on what direction to go in without knowing where you are going?

As you consider where you are going, we are also encouraging you to ask those around you where they are going. If you feel so inclined, ask them while videotaping their responses. Many folks have started posting these on our Facebook page and you can check out their responses. This is a terrific way to engage our community and to encourage them to consider this question that allows us all to deal with the end.

Remember that Jesus will return to judge the living and the dead. The scripture tells us over and over again to be ready for this day. This aspect of being prepared has less to do with Hollywood's portrayal of apocalyptic cinematic fantasies that arouse in us suspicions about our neighbors and strangers. Instead, this aspect of being prepared has more to do with us paying attention to and participating in the things that the Lord pays attention to.

For the next 12 months we are going to be journeying through the Gospel of Mark. I would encourage you to devote yourself to the reading of this good news and to pay attention to Jesus Christ in this gospel account. I pray, that all of us will grow in our devotion and love of God through this 12 month journey. And in this devotion may we set our eyes on Jesus – the author and perfecter of our faith.

tax. time! Perhaps you have noticed that the new tax law has reduced your ability to deduct your contribution to charitable entities, including Faith Harbor. For the past couple of years, you were able to deduct at least \$600 per couple. However, that amount has now gone away. In fact, unless you can itemize your deductions for more than \$27,700 for a couple (\$13,800 for a single), you can't deduct any contribution that you make to a charity. Those of you who have paid off your home mortgage usually have a tough time getting past that. **BUT THERE IS A SOLUTION**. A Qualified Charitable Contribution can be made from your IRA, 401K, or any brokerage account directly to the charity on your behalf, and

it is not included in your income (eliminating the tax you would have paid on it) and the charity gets the benefit of your donation. And if you are over the age of 73, you may need to do an RMD (Required Minimum Distribution). This is a great way to take the distribution and avoid paying income tax on those tax-free dollars and profits that you put away years ago. As we get close to the end of the year, you may want to consider taking advantage of this. For more information, see Gail Widholm, Finance Chairperson, or your tax advisor.
