
Week 3 far exceeded expectations with a whopping 401 food items delivered to the Share the Table warehouse. This total was greater than the combined totals for weeks 1 & 2. Fueling the week 3 competition was a one-day donation of 139 food items to the Pitt Panther's bin which put them in a solid third place behind NC State and Ohio State, respectively.

The result for this week has NC State in first place with a one can lead over second place Ohio State with the Pitt Panthers a solid third. Virginia Tech surged to fourth followed by UNCW in fifth place. There were only three empty bins this week which put those schools far behind the leaders.

You may drop off food at any time during the final week, The bins will be emptied and tallied for the last time on Tuesday with the final results announced on Sunday May 5, 2024, at the 9:30 service.

The final week of the competition is shaping up to be a barn burner so stay tuned for the final countdown!


