



This is from a sermon that Pastor Bescye Burnett preached last weekend. We wanted to share this with you.

"What is the question?" - Acts 8:26-40 (NIV)

Philip and the Ethiopian Eunuch

"Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means 'queen of the Ethiopians'). This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. The Spirit told Philip, 'Go to that chariot and stay near it.'

"Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. 'Do you understand what you are reading?' Philip asked. 'How can I,' he said, 'unless someone explains it to me?' So, he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading: 'He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth. In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth.' The eunuch asked Philip, 'Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?' Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?' And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing. Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea."

Last week again we had what I call a story or should I say an episode in the Bible as written by Luke in Acts taken out of context and given to us to read. What I would like so much to do is dialogue. So, I ask "what is the question?" **Pause** here for a moment and let's talk about these verses...what do you know about them? Remember the sermon title is "What is the question?

What do you know about Philip? What do you know about the Ethiopian eunuch? What do you know about what he was reading? How important is all of this in this text?

There was so much going on in the life of both Philip and the Ethiopian before they came to this point. Yet they both ended up in the same place...on a desert road... Jerusalem to Gaza.

The angel told Philip to go to this place...probably during a pretty difficult time in his life...go to this desert place...this road...what is the question you have about Philip? The Ethiopian Eunuch we are told had gone to Jerusalem to worship and was on his way home.

Last week I had an experience with the staff of this church because I am sure our pastor received the same kind of message. When he told me he wanted to go to my hometown of Roseboro, NC. I wanted to know why. No one intentionally goes to Roseboro. The little spot on the map. When we had some conflict with schedules I was sort of delighted and responded "you don't have to do this for me I can go to Roseboro anytime. It is home! I had already changed my schedule for something else when he called and said we are going to Roseboro.

When Philip got to the place on the desert road, he met the Ethiopian Eunuch and got another message...this time from the Spirit...Go to the chariot and stay close.

He ran up to the chariot...The rest of the message we receive in this passage is the dialogue between the two and how the relationship developed. All the questions. Philip didn't push the Ethiopian. He let the Ethiopian lead the way.

What is the Question?

Do you understand what you are reading? How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me? Who can speak of his descendants? "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else? And then...what happened?

Philip shared the story of Jesus. The Ethiopian Eunuch was able to recognize the importance of the story and being baptized when he noticed the water. Philip allowed this to happen. The Spirit of God in that place at that time.

In Roseboro our staff met my younger sister Sheryl and my oldest cousin Marie. I didn't realize this until afterwards. Pastor asked the question...remember...what is the question? Or the statement...tell us about Bescye...First of all you'll know it now. My family calls me "Bet". Your pastor had the nerve to call me Rev. Bet. My sister and cousin said things about me that I knew and that I didn't know. I have kept my family and my home so close to my heart to my soul...

And then...what happened?

Our staff met this country girl who will always be a country girl and learned how to live in this world that God has given to her and love it but not just love it. What they learn now is if they didn't already know it is we have a Pastor who listens to the Spirit of God.

When I read this in a devotion this week this is what I knew had happened in Roseboro... my hometown..." beautiful image of what it means to be on a journey with another and to hear the word of God in new ways... the Ethiopian eunuch on his path and asking a simple question, "What are you reading?" He didn't approach the man with the attitude of "God told me to come here to tell you about Jesus," even though that was the truth. Philip respected the man more than that. He let the eunuch lead, and lead he did, by inviting Philip to sit with him, to listen to the word, and to ask the questions. Philip responded, "starting with this scripture," the place where the man was meditating, and from there he shared the good news of Jesus. Even after this conversation, Philip didn't instruct the Eunuch what to do next, but allowed the man to discover his own next step. "Here is water; what is to prevent me from being baptized?"

And then...what happened?

"When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing. Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea."

God's Spirit is never put in a box. We do so much to box it up. The Spirit, a constant presence. God's Spirit doing as it pleases and not boxed in by human expectations and limitations. Thanks be to God!

Notes from the Board of Trustees:

- 1. The sidewalk has been completed, using semi permeable concrete that merges seamlessly with the existing wooden walkway.
- 2. We hired a contractor to distribute the dirt and mulch on our property, and to clear and deepen the drainage ditches. We are still waiting for NCDoT to work on the ditch near the road in front of our property, but the drainage issue has improved tremendously.
- 3. The kitchen now has a working dishwasher, stove and vent, and sinks. We have ordered a few miscellaneous items and renovation is nearly complete. We will hold a brief "training" to help people learn to use the new kitchen before the family dinner / talent show on June 5th (5:30 pm).
- 4. Pastor Philip and his father, Bob Chryst, have installed lower cabinets (leftover from the kitchen remodel) and open shelving in the "music room" to the left of the choir loft. They added wheels to the filing cabinets and built a portable desk for the music director that can be stashed out of sight during services.
- 5. We will host a work team in May and hope they will start building a prayer walkway along the unused land.
- 6. The trustees would like to thank the preschool for paying the electric bill for the entire church!
- 7. Upcoming projects include replacing an indoor and outdoor HVAC unit in the sanctuary, replacing part or all of the sound system, and possible repair of lighting in the sanctuary.




