One of the most interesting things to me that you all have brought to my attention is the Ocean City area of Topsail Island. I have explored just a small part of the history behind Ocean City. This has opened my eyes to the rich history of the African-American community here in our area. It is a history that has deep roots in this area. As I have been learning more, it has caused me to be captivated by a history that is oftentimes neglected and forgotten.

With that in mind, I have been in contact with some of the leaders of the Ocean City Jazz Festival. They have a "Learn & Hike" coming up on Saturday, July 6th at 7:45am at 2649 Island Dr., North Topsail Beach NC. They have graciously given us four additional spots for this learn & hike. The brochure states: "Ocean City residents and descendants of first time home builders will lead a 2 mile out and back learn and hike event. Expect to see and be informed about the community's vintaged beach homes, significant regional and state historical markers, the beautiful Wade Chestnut Chapel, and the National Registered Navy Bumblebee Tower #6."







We hope to see you at our next gathering on July 23, 2024 at 6 PM, hosted by Tom Jackson


At the May meeting it was decided to forgo the regular monthly meetings for June, July and August and replace them with an informal gathering at different locations hosted by one or more members.
