


Ephesians 4.12: "to equip the saints for the work of ministry."

Author Curtis Hardison, author of Griot: The Evolution of Edgecombe, A Historical Perspective, will be making a presentation at Faith Harbor on Thursday, August 22, 2024, at 6pm. Mr. Hardison will have books available, and you will be given a chance to have him sign books. Mr. Hardison, who retired from the U.S. Secret Service, is a native of Edgecombe who currently resides in Washington, D.C.

The event will begin at 6pm with a meal and then will proceed to the Sanctuary for the presentation that will be from 6:45pm-7:45pm. All are

invited to this wonderful event. You can learn more about Mr. Hardison's book below.

Griot: The Evolution of Edgecombe is a true story that chronicles the journey of three African captives from their homelands of Cameroon, the Central African Republic and Angola to a farm in Topsail Township, North Carolina. Hardison writes of his journey of four decades of research into his family tree going back to the early 1800s. Emancipated from slavery after the Civil War, his ancestors worked to create the farming community that evolved into the thriving independent community of Edgecombe in eastern Pender County. The book also includes stories of notable members of the Edgecombe community, including Mattie Sharpless, who served as U.S. Ambassador to the Central African Republic from 2001 through 2003.

Notes from your Faith Harbor Trustees:

- 1. Work on the drainage ditches around the church has been completed,
- 2. The Praying Pelicans team started work on the bridge for our prayer path on our undeveloped land. Another team will continue to work on this project July 13-19th.
- 3. We have replaced both the inside and outside units of the front-right-side HVAC system in the sanctuary.
- 4. The kitchen is pretty well completed. We installed a dedicated cupboard for Communion supplies, and a small table next to the stove. We remind all who use the kitchen that clean-up is required after every use!
- 5. We have a substantial donation towards the cost of replacing our sound system in the sanctuary, and will proceed with the replacement/rewiring, with minimal interruption to services or activities.
- 6. Insurance costs have skyrocketed! We're happy with our current provider but are researching options to ensure that our building is adequately covered.
- 7. We're investigating options to purchase either a small tractor or a mid-grade commercial lawn mower to maintain our grounds.

Thank you for supporting our Board of Trustees as we strive to make cost-effective decisions about our church.




