This is from the Austin Family. Doug & Paula are an active part of Faith Harbor, and they spend some time out of their year in the mountains. This tells about their experience during Hurricane Helene.

This is long, even for me. I hope and pray you have had a blessed week. It is Saturday night and we are stuck in Newland after the hurricane. More details later, but my best description is a war zone.

A week ago we were flying high wrapped in God's Amazing Grace. Quickly it was Sunday afternoon and we were packing up the camp, saying goodbyes and shedding a few tears. Our plan for the week was the 1st annual VDC camping jamboree at the Pineola Lodge near grandfather mountain. The Clintons, Whiteheads, and Koceyas were all making plans to be here. We had hikes, smores, wineries, live music, and time around the campfire on the schedule. Everyone safely made the trip, but rain interrupted the first night by the fire and night #2 was chili inside a room at the lodge. We got in a hike and the weather forecast got scary. We moved from our summer site at Land Harbor to the campground with the Clintons and Whiteheads due to history of flooding. The next morning the Whiteheads decided to head home. That evening the skies opened and it got a little spooky. Our neighborhood in Linville Land Harbor flooded with 4 feet of water in the streets and on our campsite. Paula had suggested we move a day early and this little voice told me to listen.

We assumed the worst was over. We were awakened that night with 50+ mph winds. At daylight everything was fine, just rain. Late morning we saw some water rising from the river that was 800ft downhill from us. The Clintons moved closer to us and on higher ground as the water continued to rise. An hour later I'm moving the car and then the truck from the rapidly rising water. A little voice told me to get Paula and Piper out of the camper. We evacuated the camper in knee deep, rushing water to move to the lodge. My concern was the rushing water taking out the hydraulic jacks which support the 14,000lb camper. We parked in the rear of the lodge with rushing water flowing on both sides of the hotel. We watched the unbelievable fury of nature from the 2nd floor balcony.

An hour later the water started to recede. We retraced our steps to find the camper dry and undamaged. Thankfully Jim and Bonnie were also safe and no damage.

The lodge and several other campers were destroyed or severely damaged. At this point there is no electricity for all of Avery County, Watauga County or any of the high country. We have camped off-grid before, so we cranked up the generators and made the best of it. Two hours later all cell service stopped. We are completely cut off from the world.

Late yesterday Jim and I ventured out hoping to find gas for my generator. The Town of Newland had no power and thus no gas. The parking lots in this small town are gone. The asphalt looks like pancakes that stuck to the pan and were then flipped. We made the short trip to Land Harbor to find bridges that are normally 15ft above the water unpassable. Power lines in the road and power poles snapped off and blocking roads. It is a warzone. We've spent today helping the Lodge owner clean up. Rooms are flooded and the grounds are a wreck. He is overwhelmed and just nods a thanks. Late afternoon, we found out we could get Wi-Fi access from Cannon Memorial Hospital, so we went to check in with family.

When we got to the hospital our phones are blowing up with messages of concern, love, and prayers. Many came from our VDC family. It was and is humbling.

There is another side of the coin. We talked with a woman yesterday on the 2nd story balcony who had lost her home and everything in it. We took her dinner tonight. She is alone in a hotel room with no power, lights, food or running water. Her family is in Mitchell County which is devastated like Avery County. The roads are blocked and she is stuck here.

We met one of our neighbors who stayed in his house. The water peaked in our neighborhood at 6.5ft. He called his kids to tell them goodbye. He is stoic and reserved, but he held on tight when I reached out to give him a hug. He then smiled and said, "I even called my ex-wife".

Last night we drove by one the shelters and saw a young family going into a school gym that has no lights, water, or heat. My guess is the little girl was two years old and tightly holding her parents hands. Why share this story? We live out of the camper 4-5 months a year for 2-3 weeks at a time. We plan for lots of variables. This week of fun has been an adventure I don't want to repeat. We are stuck here for a couple more

days. In general, it is an inconvenience and a story for our grandkids. For the people impacted by this storm and others like it, they are ill prepared. We complain when there isn't cream for the morning coffee. Consider being stuck in your own home with no fresh water to drink and no water to flush the toilet. No lights to see at night. No Facebook, internet, or tv. All you have is the challenge to clean up the mess and wait for some help. Scary and depressing aren't big enough words.

On Thursday night Ken asked us to remove our watches and turn off our phones. Except for the surprising 10-minute check-in to let families know we are safe it has been a completely disconnection from the world. I've prayed for a lot of people I don't know. I've had a few times I was overwhelmed with emotion seeing the damage. I've been blessed to be the face of Christ to a few of those hurting, but there is a massive need. With roads blocked, I expect we are here a few more days. I pray I can be Christ's hands and feet to those I meet while we are here. Pray for those impacted. Support relief efforts if you can. Since I have finished the only book I had, I was trying to find something to occupy my mind and saw my palanca bag. I was a joyful and emotional way to end my day. Not sure when this goes out, but thanks for all the messages, love, and prayers. GLYASDI

Message #2 Travel update -- 01Oct

Doug

We were able to get home yesterday. Our normal 6+ hour drive was almost 9. We left the 5th wheel and truck. The truck was too tall and wide for Hwy 221 from Newland to Boone. The camper would be off in the valley had we tried to bring it. I'm thankful to be home safe.

I grew up in Boone, so this hits close to home and my childhood memories. We have lived through Hurricane Fran in Raleigh and Hurricane Florence at Topsail. Both of those hurricanes were major storms with extreme damage. This storm is magnitudes worse. The rugged terrain is a major obstacle for rescues and restoring power. The damage to roads is greatly impacting getting in supplies and getting what they have to those in need. For most of the mountain counties, the year-round population is blue collar families. These people have nowhere to go. They have lost homes, jobs, and many of them family member(s). When we go to the mountains to ski, hike, vacation, see the leaves, These are the people that clean our rooms, serve our meals, run the chairlift, check you out at Walmart, and live paycheck to paycheck. The devastation is on both sides of the road and down every road we drove by was overwhelming. It went on for miles and we were heading away from it.

Since last Friday we have acted like refugees. We are out looking for a phone connection, water, and fuel. Owning a camper put us miles ahead of everyone else. I went three days with one 10-minute connection with our kids. I went four days without a shower, but I had fresh water, something to eat, and I was dry. For many of those stranded our simple daily routine was a luxury. We felt guilty leaving, yet there was nothing else for us to do. At this point they need our prayers and donations. Thanks for your love, prayers, and being part of my life.

If you or someone you know is interested, please share the Position Description with them and ask them to apply. Applications should include a resume/work summary, a cover letter, and two references.

Position Description Faith Harbor Youth Minister

Overview: Faith Harbor United Methodist Church is a growing church. Our Youth Minister must model a commitment to Jesus Christ as well as being committed to the values & vision of FHUMC: "A Beacon of Hope in a broken world. We seek to Anchor Our Lives in the life, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus as Lord. We strive to share God's Love in our daily lives as we reach out in Joyful Service."

Areas of Responsibility – There are six categories that make up the Youth Minister's responsibilities:

1 – Prayer

- -pray daily for youth, parents, and volunteers
- -lead prayer gatherings with youth, parents, and volunteers
- -teach youth, parents, and volunteers how to pray

2 – Visitation

- -develop relationships with youth, parents, and volunteers by visiting in their homes, schools, extracurricular activities, and various locations
- -be at FHUMC church building by 9am Sunday mornings and stay until at least 11am to:
- 1) pay attention to new families that have youth, 2) recruit volunteers, 3) visit with youth & parents
- -involve pastors in any situations that would need further attention during visiting.
- -at a minimum of four times a year go to the 8am service to lead the prayers of the people so that families at that service will get to know you.

3 – Discipleship

- -Model to youth, parents, and volunteers a commitment to Jesus Christ through your words, actions, and activities
- -Have a mentor that will be an example and a sounding board
- -invite youth to participate in the ministry by helping in volunteer positions
- -formulate discipleship opportunities for youth to learn from scripture, lessons, fellowship, and mission.
- -develop a culture of mentorship where older youth mentor younger youth volunteers mentor youth and where you mentor at least two youth and at least two volunteers. Work with pastors & mentor on how to develop this culture. This is a long-term goal.

4 – Communication

- -weekly emails (text messages) about youth activities
- -communicate with Secretary about information for weekly Messenger & Bulletin
- -communicate with Audio-Visual Coordinator about information for the overhead
- -post weekly on the FHUMC Facebook page

5 - Volunteers

- -recruit volunteers and organize training them in Safe Sanctuaries.
- -discern with volunteers how they would be best suited for the ministry of youth
- -coordinate volunteers so that they are utilized effectively in the ministry of youth
- -follow-up with volunteers on how their unique calling is being lived out through youth ministry

6 – Ministry coordination

- -coordinate Mission outings, Fun outings, and Spiritual outings for youth, parents, and volunteers.
- -coordinate youth participating in the life of the broader church church workdays, worship, volunteer opportunities.
- -work with pastor at coordinating confirmation and youth that desire to be baptized
- -coordinate with youth council
- -coordinate fund-raising opportunities (we would encourage you to limit these to four a year)
- -coordinate the gathering of all forms
- -be at all staff meetings

Qualifications: Commitment to Jesus Christ and the Lord's Church. At least 2 years of experience working with youth in a ministry setting. Strong organizational, communication, and leadership skills. Ability to build and lead volunteer teams.

Job Type:

- -Part-time position. We understand that this position can sometimes involve a lot of work especially when it comes to out-of-town trips. So, we would encourage you to schedule yourself for 20-25 hours a week on average. We are paying you while you are on trips, but we have concluded this averages out to be 5 hours a week. So, our pay structure reflects that understanding. We would encourage you to have consistent and intentional hours so that there are healthy parameters to work within.
- -Once a year you will have a job evaluation done by the Staff Parish Relations Committee.
- -It is expected that you participate in continuing education every year.


