

When you read in Mark 1:35-39, you can see that Jesus sets an example for us how we can carefully balance the three relational dimensions of our life. We see that Jesus spends time with his Father; he spends with His disciples and lastly he spends time with the world around him. In short we see Jesus spending time Up with the Father, In with his disciples and Out with the world. This is the model that the Youth at Faith Harbor have been following for the last couple of years that continues to be the basis for how the youth spend their time. The middle and high schoolers have been studying the book of Jonah this fall. We have been making posters and learning about how Jonah and God had an active life together. Jonah clearly heard from God and chose to disobey. But we also see that Jonah sought God out from the darkness, repented and sought to follow.

The middle schoolers have enjoyed time together in fellowship as they eat together after service and take trips together to places like the Trask Family corn maze. We have some incredibly talented musicians in our midst. The middle schoolers have begun to practice as a band with Ms. Amber in preparation for a special music offering in December. We have a couple of high school students who have also been practicing with Ms. Allison and Mr. Ron for another special music offering in December. You don't want to miss this! The high schoolers just came back from an overnight trip to Myrtle Beach. We played together, experienced the challenges of a ropes course together, overcame a fear of heights together, battled it out on the sand in a game of glow-n-dark volleyball, ate fresh cookies from the oven while playing board games and uno. The youth ate meals together prepared by one another, laughed together and recognized what a life-giving community looks like in their midst.

The middle schoolers and high schoolers were blessed last week to serve Faith Harbor's congregation during the November Family Night dinner. Thank you to the Pilot's Men group for believing and supporting our youth by preparing the food for the meal but also allowing the youth to serve the meal and help clean up in the kitchen. #### **NEW online course from Wesley Pathways for Ministry**

Lord, Teach Us to Pray-Learn and experience new ways to pray.

#### Introductory offer: \$25 \$5 through December 31, 2024

This six-unit course is intended for laity who do not currently have a prayer practice or who desire to go deeper in their relationship with God through prayer (clergy are also welcome). The course is experiential, inviting students to practice different forms of prayer and to discover what approaches work for them. Students will be exposed to a wide variety of prayer practices, including prayers from the African American tradition. Different practitioners share various forms of prayer.

#### Course learning objectives:

- Students will be exposed to at least ten different prayer practices, including silence, Lectio Divina (praying using scripture), awe practices, nature walks, the Psalms of lament and new orientation, using visual images for prayer, prayers for peace and justice, icons, and Christian mindfulness.
- Students will practice at least six different prayer practices and will reflect on their prayer experiences by journaling in words or images.

#### **Having a Grief Night**

There is great strength in community, the coming together in Christ and building up of one another to love and good deeds. And there are times when a person needs community more than ever. Dr. Larry Crabb shares how his Sunday school class has responded to this need by implementing a practice called a grief night. "We're there basically to pour something of the reality of Christ into the one who is bereaved," says Dr. Crabb. Here are the steps to holding a grief night for a person who is grieving:Plan a time to meet as a group. To begin the grief night, light a candle to symbolize the one who is not there.

- 1. Have others ask the grieving person random questions about the loved one who has died to get to know the deceased individual better. "What do you miss the most about your loved one?" "What places or smells bring back special memories?" Also ask tough questions such as, "Did your lost loved one make financial and other preparations for those they would leave behind?" Let the person talk.
- 2. After about an hour of questions, tears, and sharing, take time to respond to the grieving person. This is not a time for platitudes and advice, but for a pouring out of love and connectedness from one heart to another.
- 3. Next is prayer time. Have the grieving person sit in the center of the group, and people who want to can lay their hands on the bereaved person. Then come before God in worship and in pleading and petition for the bereaved.
- 4. Last is song time. Sing favorites of the one who died or of the one who is grieving.

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:25).

Loving Father, healing is possible in the community of believers. Lead me to meet together regularly with other people who believe in You. Amen.
