

An excerpt from Justin Martyr (ca. 153) – First Apology, 67.

"On the day called Sunday there is a gathering together in the same place of all who live in a given city or rural district. The memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as time permits. Then when the reader ceases, the president in a discourse admonishes and urges the imitation of these good things. Next we all rise together and send up prayers.

"When we cease from our prayer, bread is presented and wine and water. The president in the same manner sends up prayers and thanksgivings, according to his ability, and the people sing out their assent, saying the "Amen." A distribution and participation of the elements for which thanks have been given is made to each person, and to those who are not present they are sent by the deacons.

"Those who have means and are willing, each according to his own choice, gives what he wills, and what is collected is deposited with the president. He provides for the orphans and widows, those who are in need on account of sickness or some other cause, those who are in bonds, strangers who are sojourning, and in a word he becomes the protector of all who are in need.

"We all make our assembly in common on Sunday, since it is the first day, on which God changed the darkness and matter and made the world, and Jesus Christ our Savior arose from the dead on the same day. For they crucified him on the day before Saturn's day, and on the day after (which is the day of the Sun) he appeared to his apostles and disciples and taught these things, which we have offered for your consideration."

Here is the layout of the worship service that Justin Martyr highlighted around ca. 153:

- 1 Gathering for worship on Sunday
- 2 Reading of Apostles & Prophets
- 3 Sermon
- 4 Prayers of the People
- 5 Presentation of communion elements
- 6 Prayers & Thanksgiving over Lord's Supper
- 7 The great "Amen".
- 8 Distribution of Elements
- 9 Giving

Take note that this order is the first ever written down. Pay attention to his observation: there is the Word of God read, prayed, and preached – and then the response of the people through prayers, giving, Lord's Supper, and distribution of the elements. We can find from this a pattern of Call & Response.

As we have been studying worship for the last month – we have learned about the sacraments, the prayers, and the singing. We now are going to explore how God reveals himself to us through scripture, prayers, singing, and sermons – and how we get a chance to respond to God's self revelation. I would encourage you to continue to learn more about this pattern – and allow this godly pattern of call & response to affect the entirety of our way of being.

*NEW online course from Wesley Pathways for Ministry

Lord, Teach Us to Pray- Learn and experience new ways to pray.

Introductory offer: \$25 \$5 through December 31, 2024. This six-unit course is intended for laity who do not currently have a prayer practice or who desire to go deeper in their relationship with God through prayer (clergy are also welcome). The course is experiential, inviting students to practice different forms of prayer and to discover what approaches work for them. Students will be exposed to a wide variety of prayer practices, including prayers from the African American tradition. Different practitioners share various forms of prayer.

Course learning objectives:
