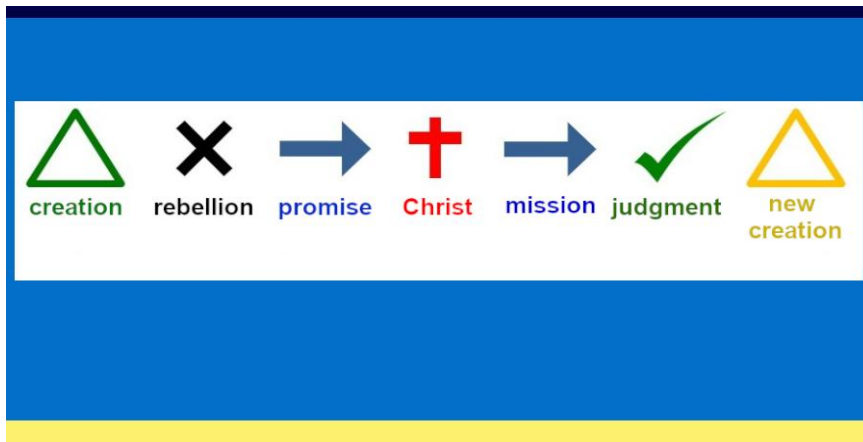

In Search of: Audio Visual Technician

Job Summary: The Church Audio-Visual Technician will be responsible for creating and executing visual presentations for Sunday services, operating sound equipment during worship services, managing video capture and streaming services, and overseeing a team of AV volunteers. This role is instrumental in ensuring that our congregation receives a seamless and spiritually uplifting experience during worship services.

Job Responsibilities:

1. Visual Presentations:

- Create visual presentations, including slideshows, videos, lyrics and graphics, to enhance the worship experience.
- Collaborate with the worship team and pastors as needed to integrate visuals that complement the message and theme of each service.

2. Sound Equipment Operation:

- Set up, operate, and maintain audio equipment, including microphones, mixers, and speakers, to ensure high-quality sound during Sunday services and other events.
- Perform sound checks and adjustments to ensure clear and balanced audio.

3. Video Capture and Streaming:

- Operate AV recording and streaming equipment to broadcast services to remote audiences.
- Troubleshoot any technical issues during live streaming, ensuring a smooth and uninterrupted online experience.

4. Team Training & Management:

- Recruit, train, and schedule a team of AV volunteers to assist with various audio-visual tasks.
- Provide guidance and support to volunteers, fostering a collaborative and positive working environment.
- Conduct training sessions as needed to ensure continuous improvement and skill development.

5. Equipment Maintenance:

- Perform maintenance and quality checks on all audio-visual equipment to ensure optimal performance.
- Coordinate repairs or replacements when necessary and keep an inventory of equipment and supplies.

6. Technical Support:

- Offer technical support to staff and volunteers during events and services.
- Troubleshoot and resolve any technical issues promptly to minimize disruptions.

Qualifications:

- Proven experience in audio-visual technology, preferably in a church or worship setting.
- Proficiency with audio and visual equipment, software, and systems.
- Strong organizational and leadership skills to manage a team of volunteers effectively.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- A strong commitment to the mission and values of Faith Harbor United Methodist Church.

Schedule: This is a part-time position with flexible hours. The Church Audio-Visual Technician will typically be required to work on Sundays and may be needed for special events or services during the week.

SPRC Committee Children's Ministry Vacancy

The purpose of the SPRC Committee (Staff/Pastor -Parish Relations Committee) as stated in the Guidelines of the Methodist church is to "focus on building strong relationships between the staff and the congregation and the DS (District Superintendent)". The activities of this group include but are not limited to "encouraging, strengthening, nurturing, supporting, and respecting the pastor, staff and their families while promoting unity in our church". Another responsibility of this group is to solicit and interview prospective people to hire for needed vacant staff positions.

Stacie Holmes is currently filling the position of Children's Ministry Leader for us on an interim basis through the end of June 2025. Stacie has blessed our children's ministry in a special way, and we are so thankful for her service. However, her time of service is coming to an end, so we need to begin the search for her replacement. The SPRC will be actively searching to fill this position on a part-time basis and request that anyone interested in applying for the Children's Ministry position contact Gail Robinson, the SPRC chairperson. Sean Dalnodar and Leigh Bizzell will be conducting this search for the SPRC with input from Stacie Holmes. The goal is to fill this position in early June. The following is the description for the Children's Ministry position. Please pray for all involved in this search.

Position Description Faith Harbor Children's Minister

Overview: Faith Harbor United Methodist Church (FHUMC) is a growing church. Our Children's Minister must model a commitment to Jesus Christ as well as being committed to the values & vision of FHUMC: "A Beacon of Hope in a broken world. We seek to Anchor Our Lives in the life, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus as Lord. We strive to share God's Love in our daily lives as we reach out in Joyful Service." The Children's Ministry is an important part of the overall mission of the church.

Areas of Responsibility — There are six categories that make up the Children's Minister's responsibilities:

1 – Prayer

- pray daily for children, parents, and volunteers
- lead prayer gatherings with children, parents, and volunteers and teach them how to pray

2 – Relationships

- develop relationships with children, parents, and volunteers by visiting in various activities
- be at FHUMC church building by 9am Sunday mornings and stay until at least 11am to:
 - 1) pay attention to new families that have children, 2) recruit volunteers, 3) visit with children & parents
- involve pastors in any situation that would need further attention.
- at a minimum of four times/year attend the 8am service to meet families at that service get to know them.

3 – Discipleship

- model to children, parents, volunteers a commitment to Jesus Christ through words, actions, and activities
- have a mentor that will be an example and a sounding board
- invite children to participate in the ministry by helping in volunteer positions
- formulate discipleship opportunities for children to learn from scripture, lessons, fellowship, & mission.
- organize curriculum for Sunday School and monthly "Jr. bAsIC" (Brothers & Sisters in Christ).

4 – Communication

- weekly emails (text messages) about children's activities
- communicate with Church Secretary about information for weekly Messenger & Bulletin
- communicate with Audio-Visual Coordinator about information needed during Church services
- post weekly on the FHUMC Facebook page

5 – Volunteers

- recruit volunteers and organize training them in Safe Sanctuaries
- run background checks for volunteers who work with children
- discern with volunteers on how they would be best suited for the ministry of children
- coordinate volunteers so that they are utilized effectively in the ministry of children
- follow-up with volunteers on how their unique calling is being lived out through children's ministry

6 – Ministry coordination

- coordinate Mission outings, Fun outings, and Spiritual outings for children, parents, and volunteers.
- coordinate children participating in – church workdays, worship, volunteer opportunities.
- work with pastor at coordinating learning about the Bible and Communion
- coordinate with children's council
- coordinate the gathering of all forms
- be at all staff meetings (if this cannot happen, please discuss this with SPRC)

Qualifications:

- Born again Christian who feels a call by God into ministry
- Love for children and families with at least 2 years of experience working with children in a church or other educational institutions
- Strong organizational and leadership skills and Ability to build and lead volunteer teams

Other Job Information:

- Part-time position. Salary for this position is between \$10,000 and 12,000, depending on the education and experience of the job candidate. This position can sometimes involve a lot of work during Christmas & VBS. Because of that, the children's minister will earn an additional \$1,000 during special projects that are approved by the Staff Parish Relations Committee. In your regular hours, we would encourage you to have consistent and intentional hours so that there are healthy parameters to work within.
- Salary will be paid twice a month.
- Goal setting and an annual job evaluation will be accomplished by the SPRC.
- The Children's Minister should participate in some type of continuing education every year.

FROM THE FINANCE TEAM: *By the Numbers- Understanding Stewardship*

Before I begin the four-part series on *Church Finance Best Practices*, it is important to understand that it all begins with stewardship. When you hear that word, your mind likely goes immediately to “*give the church more money.*” But **biblical stewardship** is so much more than that. Biblical stewardship is about trusting Jesus with our resources. Real stewardship in the Bible is about trusting Jesus with everything. It’s about managing what He has placed in our hands. It’s not only money, but also time, energy, relationships, and influence. It’s about leaning into Jesus, not just funding ministry. Stewardship is all about the management of the resources entrusted to us by GOD. Dave Ramsey sums it up best:

“Stewardship is managing God’s blessings, God’s ways, for God’s glory...That means our time, talents, treasure, relationships, jobs, and yes, our stuff. It’s all God’s, and He trusts us with it.”

I want us to be a church that gives generously with its finances. It gives not out of obligation, guilt, or shame, but out of faith. I want each of you to spend time talking to Jesus about your finances and asking Him how much (or how little) you are to donate. I want you to look to Jesus to give your time and talents by faith and as an act of worship. **Biblical steward looks at the whole person and asks, how does Jesus want to work in and through me?** As we look into the financial future of Faith Harbor, I have one last thought that is now a part of the Policy and Procedures Manual:

“Our ultimate security and hope for the future is not the size of our church bank account or financial outlook. It’s Jesus.” Joshua Gordon

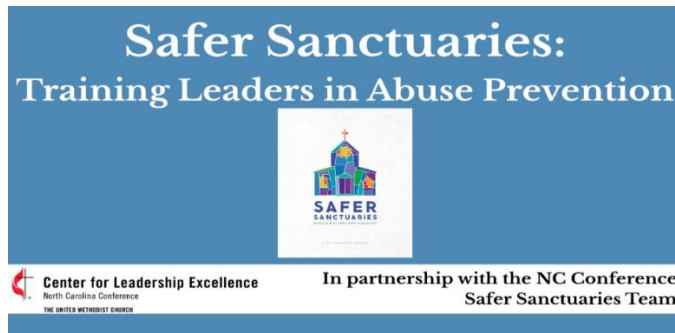

About the Workshop:

Since 1996, when the General Conference of The United Methodist Church adopted a resolution aimed at eliminating potential for abuse in the church, abuse prevention has been an important part of church policy-making and implementation. United Methodists are called to justice and advocacy for those whose voices are often overlooked or not heard, including children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Churches are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all persons. The risk of harm to children, youth, and vulnerable adults can be reduced through the implementation of abuse prevention policies.

A primary focus for the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team is to provide resources that will help churches as they develop policies, train staff/volunteers, and implement those policies. Individual church policies should be written with consideration of the church's specific context, so there is not a one-size-fits-all policy. Recommendations for abuse prevention policy content is offered by the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team and may be found on the [webpage](#). This workshop is for church leaders who will train others in abuse prevention. Participants are encouraged to bring a copy of their church abuse prevention policy.

Safer Sanctuaries: Training Leaders in Abuse Prevention is led by Rev. Charlotte Brendel, current chair of the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team.

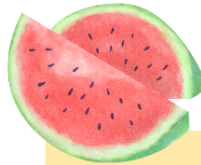
