SPRC Committee Children's Ministry Vacancy

The purpose of the SPRC Committee (Staff/Pastor -Parrish Relations Committee) as stated in the Guidelines of the Methodist church is to "focus on building strong relationships between the staff and the congregation and the DS (District Superintendent)". The activities of this group include but are not limited to "encouraging, strengthening, nurturing, supporting, and respecting the pastor, staff and their families while promoting unity in our church". Another responsibility of this group is to solicit and interview prospective people to hire for needed vacant staff positions.

SPRC will be searching to fill this position on a part-time basis and request that anyone interested in applying for the Children's Ministry position contact Gail Robinson, the SPRC chairperson. Sean Dalnodar and Leigh Bizzell will be conducting this search for the SPRC with input from Stacie Holmes. The goal is to fill this position in early June. Please pray for all involved in this search. ***Please contact the church office for job description**

FROM THE FINANCE TEAM: *By The Numbers - Finance Best Practices Part I*

Church finance best practices begin with ***Stewardship and Planning***. In Part I, there are four guidelines to be considered:

1. **Define clear financial goals.** (*Compliant*)
 - a) The finance team is working on maintaining a balanced budget.
 - b) The finance team is developing a plan to either pay off or pay down the mortgage.
 - c) Currently, there are no anticipated capital expenditures for this calendar year.
 - d) The church is currently providing services or programs in the following areas:
 - i. Adult Ministries
 - ii. Children's Ministry
 - iii. Music Ministry
 - iv. Stewardship Ministry
 - v. Youth Ministry
 - vi. Worship Ministry
 - vii. Preschool
2. **Develop a comprehensive church budget.** (*Compliant*) - Every year, the finance team, along with the Executive Council members develop a comprehensive budget that aligns with the church's mission and its financial resources.
3. **Create a long-term financial strategy** (that includes an emergency fund). (*Compliant*) - The church currently maintains a money market fund with cash reserves that will cover 3-6 months of operating expenses. The church also maintains a capital campaign fund to address medium to long-term capital expenses. Last but not least is the endowment fund that will provide resources for the future. The finance team has initiated a review of these funds to ensure maximum benefit.
4. **Diversify income streams.** (*Compliant*) - Although a majority of the church's income comes from tithes and offerings, the other income streams that provide revenue are, *Other Special Contributions*, *Other Revenues* such as interest income, Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Adult Education Ministry and the Worship Ministry. The Preschool provides a stabilizing cash flow each month since donations fluctuate from week to week.

In summary, the church is compliant in each of the four guidelines discussed in Part I. Next week, in Part II, we will look at ***Financial Management and Controls*** as it pertains to church finance best practices.

About the Workshop:

Since 1996, when the General Conference of The United Methodist Church adopted a resolution aimed at eliminating potential for abuse in the church, abuse prevention has been an important part of church policy-making and implementation. United Methodists are called to justice and advocacy for those whose voices are often overlooked or not heard, including children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Churches are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all persons. The risk of harm to children, youth, and vulnerable adults can be reduced through the implementation of abuse prevention policies.

A primary focus for the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team is to provide resources that will help churches as they develop policies, train staff/volunteers, and implement those policies. Individual church policies should be written with consideration of the church's specific context, so there is not a one-size-fits-all policy. Recommendations for abuse prevention policy content is offered by the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team and may be found on the [webpage](#). This workshop is for church leaders who will train others in abuse prevention. Participants are encouraged to bring a copy of their church abuse prevention policy.
