

The purpose of the SPRC Committee (Staff/Pastor -Parrish Relations Committee) as stated in the Guidelines of the Methodist church is to "focus on building strong relationships between the staff and the congregation and the DS (District Superintendent)". The activities of this group include but are not limited to "encouraging, strengthening, nurturing, supporting, and respecting the pastor, staff and their families while promoting unity in our church". Another responsibility of this group is to solicit and interview prospective people to hire for needed vacant staff positions.

SPRC will be searching to fill this position on a part-time basis and request that anyone interested in applying for the Children's Ministry position contact Gail Robinson, the SPRC chairperson. Sean Dalnodar and Leigh Bizzell will be conducting this search for the SPRC with input from Stacie Holmes. The goal is to fill this position in early June. # FROM THE FINANCE TEAM: By the Numbers - Finance Best Practices Part II

Proper management and financial controls are essential for the church to maintain transparency and accountability through *Financial Management and Controls*. In Part II, there are four guidelines to be considered:

- 1. **Segregation of Duties**. (*Compliant*) This means that a different person should handle money, record transactions, and reconcile bank accounts. This creates a form of checks and balances within the church to ensure there is oversight and that you will be able to catch errors when they happen. This is spelled out in detail in the newly revised policy and procedures manual. It can be found under the major heading of *Internal Financial Control Policies*.
- 2. **Implement robust accounting systems and software.** (*Compliant*) Since partnering with ACS Technologies, the church has strengthened its financial management. Utilizing the REALM software the finance team can streamline processes for better financial management, track donations, and manage resources more effectively.
- 3. **Conduct regular financial reviews.** (*Compliant*) Regular audits from an outside accounting firm will ensure that all funds are being managed responsibly. Since partnering with James Jordan and ACS Technologies the church is in a better financial position to meet this guideline. The finance team is making plans for a full review this fall.
- 4. Set up a church finance committee. (*Compliant*) A good church finance committee ensures financial integrity, prepares and reviews financial statements, supports long-term planning, and foster transparency and trust within the church community. The church finance team is working hard in implementing and following these practices as defined in the newly revised and comprehensive policy and procedures manual.

In summary, the church is compliant with each of the four guidelines discussed in Part I in addition to the four discussed in Part II. Next week, in Part III, we will look at *Member Giving* as it pertains to church finance best practices. #### About the Workshop:

Since 1996, when the General Conference of The United Methodist Church adopted a resolution aimed at eliminating potential for abuse in the church, abuse prevention has been an important part of church policy-making and implementation. United Methodists are called to justice and advocacy for those whose voices are often overlooked or not heard, including children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Churches are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all persons. The risk of harm to children, youth, and vulnerable adults can be reduced through the implementation of abuse prevention policies.

A primary focus for the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team is to provide resources that will help churches as they develop policies, train staff/volunteers, and implement those policies. Individual church policies should be written with consideration of the church's specific context, so there is not a one-size-fits-all policy. Recommendations for abuse prevention policy content is offered by the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team and may be found on the <u>webpage</u>. This workshop is for church leaders who will train others in abuse prevention. Participants are encouraged to bring a copy of their church abuse prevention policy.

*Safer Sanctuaries: Training Leaders in Abuse Prevention* is led by Rev. Charlotte Brendel, current chair of the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team.
