FROM THE FINANCE TEAM: By the Numbers - Finance Best Practices Part IV

It is important for the church members to know that there is openness and accountability with church funds. In this part we will explore *Transparency and Accountability*. In Part IV, there are three guidelines to be considered:

- 1. **Keep leadership and the congregation in the loop.** (*Compliant*) It is the responsibility of the Finance Team to keep the leadership, the committee chairs and the congregation informed on church's financial health. Each of these groups require a different level of information so the Finance Team has or is in the process of developing reports that meets the needs of each of these groups. The reports are delivered in a variety of ways (i.e. weekly Messenger, Sunday Bulletin, monthly postings, committee meetings, YTD & monthly budget reports). In addition, one-time special reports can be delivered on a request basis.
- 2. **Get professional advice.** (*Compliant*) The church has professional relationship with James B. Jordan, CPA and partners with ASC Technologies for our bookkeeping services.
- 3. **Clear policies on Fund Usage.** (*Compliant*) Through the newly revised policy and procedures manual there is a clear policy on how restricted funds are to be received and handled. The specific laws around how restricted funds can be used is clearly defined in the manual.

In summary, there were fifteen total guidelines that have been discussed in this four-part series. The church is 100% compliant with these guidelines. It's through following these guidelines that the church has been able to maintain a healthy financial position throughout the years, but it is not a measure of knowing if we are succeeding as good stewards.

First and foremost, developing and maintaining church financial best practices is about true biblical stewardship. It's not only about the money, but about the whole individual offering back to God of their time, talents, and possessions. It's knowing and understanding that everything we have comes from God as a gift from Him, and that we have been entrusted to care for his resources.



About the Workshop:

Since 1996, when the General Conference of The United Methodist Church adopted a resolution aimed at eliminating potential for abuse in the church, abuse prevention has been an important part of church policy-making and implementation. United Methodists are called to justice and advocacy for those whose voices are often overlooked or not heard, including children, youth, and vulnerable adults. Churches are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all persons. The risk of harm to children, youth, and vulnerable adults can be reduced through the implementation of abuse prevention policies.

A primary focus for the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team is to provide resources that will help churches as they develop policies, train staff/volunteers, and implement those policies. Individual church policies should be written with consideration of the church's specific context, so there is not a one-size-fits-all policy. Recommendations for abuse prevention policy content is offered by the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team and may be found on the webpage. This workshop is for church leaders who will train others in abuse prevention. Participants are encouraged to bring a copy of their church abuse prevention policy.

Safer Sanctuaries: Training Leaders in Abuse Prevention is led by Rev. Charlotte Brendel, current chair of the NCC Safer Sanctuaries Team.


