This is an encounter where words are not sufficient. That it is a revelations, that it is something that defies rational explanations. It is an encounter that is considered and the contemplative gazes upon.

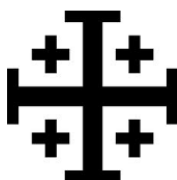
To me this reminds me of much of the work of Minnie Evans (1892-1987). Minnie Evans was a

gifted artist from Wilmington that had great influence on the Harlem Renaissance. Her work can be seen in places all over Wilmington, while at the same time in places like the Museum of Modern Art in New York. Her work is based on mystical encounters that she had and is reminiscent of some of the scenes from Ezekiel, Revelation, and Daniel.

This will be shown at Manhollow Missionary Baptist Church, which is located at 55 Manhollow Church Road, Hampstead.
