Primary Responsibility

Lay Leader- Encourages and equips the laity for ministry and serves as a connection between the congregation and conference.

Lay Delegate to Annual Conference- Represents the church at the conference with voice/vote and reports back to the congregation.

Finance Committee- Oversees the church budget, stewardship, financial reporting, and fiscal accountability.

Finance Chair- Leads the Finance Committee and presents financial matters to Church Council and the congregation.

Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC)- Supports, evaluates & maintains healthy relationships between staff, pastor & congregation.

SPRC Chair- Leads meetings, communicates with the District Superintendent when necessary, and helps address staff concerns.

Trustees- Care for church property, buildings, grounds, insurance, and legal matters.

Worship Chair- Coordinates and supports the worship life of the church, including volunteers and seasonal worship preparations.

Worship Committee- Sanctuary decorations, paraments, seasonal displays, and participate as a communion server.

Secretary- Keeps minutes for Church Council and other designated meetings. **Finance Secretary**- Provides financial reports.

Missions/Outreach Committee- Coordinates mission projects, community outreach, and opportunities for service.

Young Adult Representative- Shares the interests and concerns of young adults with church leadership. Encourages young adults to participate in worship, missions, small groups, and church activities.

Youth Coordinator/Chair- Supports and develops ministries for middle and high school students.

We invite anyone who feels called to serve on the Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) to consider volunteering. Due to unforeseen personal circumstances, two committee members have stepped down, and with two additional members completing their terms at the end of this year, we are looking to appoint two new members to begin serving on **October 1 and two additional members to begin serving 1 Jan 2027.**

SPRC is a three-year commitment and serves as the church's personnel and staff support committee. While we meet at least quarterly, the role often requires additional time as we work alongside the pastor and church leadership to support our staff, develop policies and position descriptions, improve hiring and onboarding, conduct performance evaluations, and help create a healthy, Christ-centered work environment where our staff can thrive. Employment Opportunity: Board of Trustees (BOT) is seeking a church member or regular attendee to fill the position of Property Manager. This is a paid position at a rate of \$500/month (1099). The position entails:

- becoming familiar with the church facility and grounds, its various systems and general levels of upkeep
- becoming familiar with the various vendors and outside parties that have formal active service contracts with FHUMC, or that have routinely performed such services in the past
- visiting the FHUMC facility on a regular basis to check in with staff regarding maintenance needs
- along with staff & BOT, be the immediate contact if/when an emergency repair arises
- seek competing service quotes for repairs that exceed an agreed cost threshold (for BOT decision)
- receive requests from Staff/BOT when maintenance issues arise, and oversee the completion of the repairs
- communicate periodically with the members of the BOT to report on completion and cost of repairs by outside services, or to seek guidance on whether to proceed with a particular repair or project

We are seeking an individual who is retired and generally available during the week, or at least one who is not bound by employer time or job location demands, who is somewhat knowledgeable of basic maintenance and “handyman” projects, and who also might be capable of voluntarily performing an occasional “handyman” project. We are not seeking an individual to have any sort of ongoing presence at FHUMC or to provide an ongoing series of “handyman” services. Rather we are seeking someone who could assist in coordinating volunteer efforts from amongst our congregation when there is a lessened level of urgency of performing a repair or upkeep project.

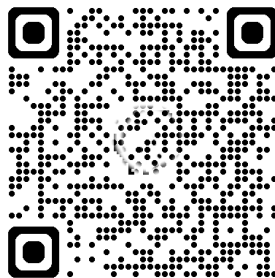

Minutes of FHUMC Board of Trustees Meeting – 5:00pm – Monday, August 03, 2026

In Attendance: John Kennedy, John Weaver, Nancy McCurtin, Danny Baisden, Pastor Bobby & Guest Sharon Jordan

1. Opening/Prayer by Pastor Bobby
2. John W asked Pastor to recap the “hunter-in-forest” analogy he has used in several of his first 4 weeks of sermons: “Pray, Aim High, Focus”. John respectfully added the possibility that the hunter also needed to decide to venture into the forest to begin with; and then followed by suggesting that, with respect to the considerations surrounding the potential Emergency Shelter for Homeless, that BOT had “ventured into the forest”, and that now FHUMC, led by the Leadership Committee, was in a season of prayer with respect to this “high aim”. If, after this season of prayer, FHUMC proceeds in an attempt to participate in this particular nascent ministry, BOT will re-engage to help “focus” on its enactment.
3. Electrical Lighting Concerns – Guest Contractor (not present, as planned)
 - a. 6 lights are out in the Sanctuary
 - b. Over many years, various property managers and now the present BOT have engaged with an electrician who has “kept the lighting in the Sanctuary functioning”. In June, when asked to come see the lighting issue, he declared something to the effect: “there was nothing more that can be done... the system needed to be completely replaced, and it was going to be expensive”.
 - c. FHUMC has a series of lighting control panels mounted on the wall in the storage room to the left side of the Chancel. The control panels are/were apparently intended to (perhaps?) be able to provide some higher level of controls for pre-set lighting settings for (perhaps?) dramatic evening performances
 - d. A quote was sought from Lighthouse Electric who quoted \$1,875 to replace the 6 lights, but this contractor does not have the “lived experience” of the history of the system repairs over the many years.
 - e. The intention was for the other electrician, with ongoing experience, to be present to explain:
 - i. The workings of the lighting control system
 - ii. what has been repeatedly failing?
 - iii. what do the lighting system controls do that is different than the way a lighting power circuit works?
 - iv. can the control system be disabled and disconnected from having the capability of controlling the lighting system and then have the lights work solely at the flipping of a switch or the turning of a dimmer? I.e: if FHUMC deems the lighting control capability as not being necessary (John Weaver is unaware of any such special usage since 2017 – has it ever been used for its intended purpose?)
 - v. or are the power and control systems specially integrated such that even disabling the controls system is perhaps an expensive (but perhaps necessary) endeavor
 - f. The electrician could not be present due to a death in his family
 - g. John Kennedy has been the contact with this electrician and will schedule an alternate visit to meet with John K, John W and Danny B to sort out all of these questions.
 - h. BOT judges that although this needs to be addressed as soon as possible, the absolute need for evening lights will not be needed until September, assuming that the lights that currently function remain so.
4. Blood Drive Request

John W pre-composed the followed motion, which was seconded by Danny Baisden: “With a minimum of 60 cal days notice, BOT approves future scheduling of Red Cross Blood Drive events at FHUMC, assuming that the event has received the approval of both the Preschool Director (should the event coincide with Preschool hours) and the Pastor, and that there are no FHUMC-scheduled events that might prevent coordination on a particular date.” Motion passed 4-0.
5. Facility Manager Status
 - a. Since Sal left with no notice in mid-June, BOT has been slow to seek a replacement.
 - b. A name had surfaced and John W reported having spoken at length with this gentleman, who proposed to make a weekly visit to see the facility firsthand and speak with relevant present staff (secretary and preschool director) and Pastor Bobby. He would do “easy” tasks that could be accomplished in the course of that visit, but for larger/lengthier work tasks, he would charge \$35 or \$40 per hour. He proposed to charge \$400 per month (plus tax) for the base service, which would have allowed about 2 hours of “extras” per month in order to stay close to the \$6,000/year budget.
 - c. Job opening message for the property manager position was started in the Messenger on 7/30.
 - d. FHUMC has fulfilled this position successfully with knowledgeable “handy-men” (Shade and Lou) from within the congregation for longer than any current BOT members can remember. Our experiment with an outsider fulfilling this position (Sal) was unsuccessful.
6. BOT Line Items/Budget Status

John Weaver has done a mid-year budget review which had not been done by meeting time. There will be another month of spending data to review at the next BOT meeting. There have been some high expenditures with the HVAC repairs that have occurred YTD, but John’s post-meeting analysis projects year-end BOT budget line items to be below budget when viewed collectively. John’s mid-year (7-month) analysis is attached.

7. HVAC Reserve Fund

John Weaver spoke about the intent to meet with Finance regarding the naming and usage of the “HVAC Reserve Fund”. This fund was set up a long time ago, with the intent that the most expensive systems in the church were the 4 main HVAC systems serving the Sanctuary, along with the several smaller systems controlling A/C for the classroom/offices wing. This fund sets up a financial “fence” within FHUMC’s bank account(s) that is not to be touched except for major HVAC repairs. The last replacement of one of the 4 main systems cost ~\$13,000 in 2024. The fund has been reported to have a \$30,000 balance, and BOT’s budget typically endeavors to allow \$6,000 to be added per year to keep this balance healthy for when the need arises for replacing more than 1 expensive system in a given calendar year. However, FHUMC has other expensive systems (e.g.: \$9,000 sound system panel replaced in 2025, mostly using donations, not plate offerings; current possibility of an expensive lighting controls system replacement or disabling). The question: since these are simply plate offerings that are being “reserved”, why not expand the definition to read “Major Systems Reserve”, and make use of the set-aside funds for some minimum threshold of major system repairs and/or replacements? John W & Danny B (who has been our nominal voice at Finance meetings) will bring this query to Finance/discuss it at the next meeting.

8. Other Items for Consideration?

a. Danny reported that the van had already been inspected. \$160 was reported as “Van inspection” in the Finance ledger that was received just before the meeting, but John W has not yet investigated to ensure that this is the registration fee. If it is registration, then the inspection/registration process is complete for next 12 months

b. John K is resigning his position from BOT effective immediately. He presented a brief letter to that effect but also pledged to be present when the electrician can meet, since he was the initiator of that meeting with BOT that was not able to happen the night of the meeting. There was an informal observation made by Nancy M about perhaps our guest (Sharon Jordan) fulfilling the BOT position that John K is vacating. John W asked Pastor Bobby to please consider what would be the most appropriate means of finding a replacement, whether for the remainder of the year, or for the remainder of John K’s 3-year term (2026-2028)

9. Set Next BOT Meeting: Tuesday September 22nd – 5pm – room 6 – 2027 budget establishment to be the focus

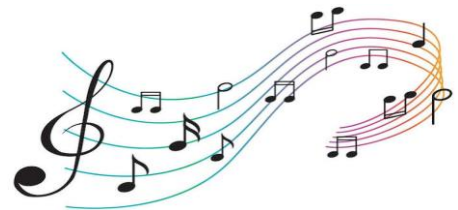
